Even before the pandemic, the structure by which the Diocese has traditionally used to resource our parish catechetical leaders (youth ministry, religious education, family faith, RCIA and Adult faith, and sacramental preparation) has been less helpful for a sizeable number of our colleagues. The pandemic multiplied these many facets. Furthermore, between the changing landscape of PCL employment (full time, part time, and volunteer) as

well as the unique needs associated with specific ministries within lifelong formation in faith, our structure needs to be reimagined through \underline{YOUR} perspective.

You are invited to All Saints Parish in Stuart on August 24 from 9:30 am to 2:30 pm to be renewed in your ministry and to recast formation enrichment sessions for you that will help you move the mission forward.

Each of you are very aware of your need for continual growth and learning. The questions to ask is:

- What meaningful formation and/or networking do you need to help you in your specific ministry?
- What is the best way to deliver this formation to you so that we build community in that mentoring and networking organically grow?
- How often should these sessions be held so that you will attend and what time of day works best in your work/family life?
- What topics need to be addressed that helps you and your parish community lean into mission?

Consecration to St. Joseph and Mass on August 15 with Bishop Joensen:



By now many of you have heard, or have become familiar with Fr. Donald Calloway's 33 Day Consecration to St. Joseph. Many individuals, as well as groups, have consecrated themselves to the Protector of the Universal Church since the release of his book in January 2020, along with Pope Francis declaring this the year of St. Joseph. Attached to this E-Newsletter is a flyer and a consecration to St. Joseph FAQ sheet.

There is a focused effort to introduce even more people to the intercessory power of St. Joseph while commemorating the 110th Anniversary of the Des Moines Diocese. An outdoor celebration

of Mass and Consecration to St. Joseph will take place on Aug. 15th, 2021 at St. Patrick's Irish Settlement parish in Cumming at 4:00 pm, with Bishop William M. Joensen presiding. Those who have already been consecrated are invited to participate, as well as those who will complete their 33 day preparation on that day.

Please discern taking an active role in leading, or coordinating, groups through the 33 days of preparation which should begin on July 14th. In your parish communications, parishioners are encouraged to pray for their openness to participation in this unique event. Whether the consecration is made individually, or as a part of a group, please openly share the invitation to join this sacred event on Aug. 15th. The goal is to lead more souls into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ through the powerful guidance of St. Joseph.

Beginning July 14th tune into <u>Iowa Catholic Radio</u> each day at 3:20pm, or following the Divine Mercy Chaplet, to hear the prayers of Consecration to St. Joseph.

loving, parental relationship with their child. With his encyclical Laudato Si', Pope Francis invites us to understand more deeply our relationships with God, one another, and the rest of creation, and to live accordingly. "Everything is connected," he reminds us (LS 91).
