- Party like its 2019. Seriously plan some fun, meaningful parish-wide gatherings to help rebuild community and just plain have a good time.
- Focus on (the whole) family. If we have learned anything from this experience, it's how reliant we are on parents to pass on faith to their kids. Now, in the Year of the Family, it's time to evangelize and coach parents by bringing them into the faith formation process.

• Make a difference in the world. People want to make a difference. One of the best ways to attract them—families and young people in particular—is to help them serve in community.

A few updates to the Newly Updated Approved Curriculum List:



Thanks to Barb Wolter (St. Patrick parish, Perry) I realized we left two resources off of the list:

- <u>Faith Fusion:</u> Knowing, Loving, and Serving Christ in grades 3-5 and grades 6-8 (Our Sunday Visitor)
- <u>Altaration</u> (Ascension Press) Many parishes are using this resource to help teens learn the significance and beauty of the Mass and it is very well done.

Clarifications on support resources such as Catechisms (the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the YOUCat, and the USCCB Adult Catechism) are always approved

resources as are Catholic translations of Bibles. Please keep in mind that Catechisms do not have curriculums included so you will want to use them in concert with an approved curriculum.

Additions to the Diocesan Approved Curriculum List (attached) reflect Bishop William Joensen's vision. There is no perfect curriculum. However limited curriculum opportunities presented by emerging and established formational partners don't allow for the innovation needed to respond to our current ministerial challenges as well limiting subsidiarity. This list doesn't include, nor ever will, the entire USCCB conformity list. Bishop Joensen reserves the privilege to add additional titles once they are reviewed by Diocesan staff. Contact John Gaffney if there are new titles you wish to explore that are not on this current curated list. Conditional approval is usually authorized for assessment purposes before full approval is granted.

Wednesday (August 18) is the deadline day for signing up for digital courses offered in Cycle 6 from the <u>Virtual</u>

<u>University of Dayton</u>. Cycle 6

courses will run from August 22 through September 25.

Go to <u>this link</u> and select Cycle 6. When you click on Cycle 6 you will see a listing of the courses being offered. There is a course listed to meet most everyone's need or interest. Sign in (or create your profile, if you've not already done so) to register for a course.

Remember that you and others on staff or parishioners in ministry roles are eligible to take VLCFF courses at no cost (as long as you complete the course)! The St. Joseph Educational Center and the Diocese of Des Moines wants to help you and others in ministry to grow in spirituality, theology and ministry skills, so please take advantage and invite others to participate. The SJEC pays the fees for those in the Des Moines region while the Diocese of Des Moines pays for everyone in the other five regions.

Remember, do not pay for the course, as SJEC or the Diocese of Des Moines will pay for all coursework at the end of the cycle, provided the course is completed.
