<u>Final Call for early bird tickets - 10th National Eucharistic Congress Early Bird Ticket Process:</u>



This is a reminder that the early bird ticket request deadline is Monday, January 16, 2023. The email below is what was sent out on December 16, 2022 spotlighting our process.

Your pastor may have already reserved the allocation for your parish. However, if he hasn't, you may want to visit with him and see if he wants to reserve the two tickets for each parish community (three tickets if your parish includes a school). The early bird ticket price is \$200.00. I will extend the ticket offer to all the faithful on January 16, based upon how many are available.

Email me if you have questions or would like to check if your parish has reserved your allocation. Tickets will cost \$350.00 beginning in February and I know our allotment of early bird tickets will run out once the tickets are available to the faithful of SW Iowa

National Eucharistic Congress Advanced Ticket Process:

• The National Eucharistic Congress will be held in Indianapolis on July 17-21, 2024.

- The Diocese of Des Moines has reserved 200 tickets, the most we could reserve for our size.
- Advanced ticket price is \$200.00 per ticket.
- 2 tickets reserved per parish for example Father Trevor Chicoine will have four tickets reserved: two for St. Mary parish in Anita and two for Ss. Peter & Paul parish in Atlantic
- 1 ticket reserved per school
- 10 tickets reserved for Pastoral Center Staff
- 6 tickets reserved for religious
- 6 tickets reserved for seminarians
- 2 tickets for members of the Diocesan Pastoral Commission or Young Catholic Adult leadership
- Tickets need to be ordered by January 15, 2023 by emailing John Gaffney at <u>jgaffney@dmdiocese.org</u>. Reserve tickets not ordered by January 15 will be pooled together and offered to all groups on a first come/first serve basis.
- The Diocese will invoice your parish for ordered tickets.
- Beginning in February, the ticket price increases to \$350.00 once our allocation of 200 tickets is exhausted.

National Catholic Youth Conference (NCYC) 2023 November 16-19, 2023 in Indianapolis:



You are invited to come to Indianapolis with us from November 16 through 19, 2023, as we join thousands of other young people from around the country for this wonderful experience of the vibrancy and life that exists in the young Church. There's nothing like being in the midst of the young Church to bring home the message that we are part of something much bigger than our local parish communities.

NCYC Indianapolis is the largest gathering of Catholic youth in the country--it is a biennial three-day experience of prayer, community, and empowerment for Catholic teenagers and their adult chaperones. Teens and their group leaders enjoy speakers, workshops, live music, rousing large sessions, reconciliation, and a beautiful closing liturgy.

Perhaps best of all, teens are part of an enormous community of peers who love Jesus and their Catholic faith, and aren't afraid to show it. Teens and youth leaders will be assisted with harnessing the experience and bringing it back to their parishes.
