John will also share with us:


- what is available today through NCCL to help all leaders in lifelong formation in faith and how you can participate,

September 18, 2022 is Catechetical Sunday:



Catechetical Sunday is a great opportunity for all Catholics to rededicate themselves to the mission of passing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel as a community of faith. The theme is: *“This is my body given for you”* Those who the parish community has designated to serve as catechists will be called forth to be commissioned for their ministry.

I Need to Learn How to Engage Parents More Effectively, but where do I begin?



I have spent a great deal of time on the road over the last six weeks and the one theme that has emerged is, **“How do I engage parents once again?”**

Some of the comments I heard are:

- Getting kids to show up is like pulling teeth, especially for the family to go to Mass.
- Young people are leaving the church in droves and I need mom and dad to understand that we need to work together.

- For whatever reason, parents delegate all the teaching to parish leaders. How do I help them realize this is their responsibility and I want to help them?

And here is the hope that I have heard even though most of us aren't always sure what is the next best step:

- I am unsure if I want to pivot completely to family faith formation, but I do recognize that some family formation will help bring families together. What is the best way to begin?
- When I have receptive parents wanting to be more involved in their children's faith life, how do I coach them to share their faith?
- What are some simple ways in which to refine my program with some family formation that is simple, easy to direct, and easy on the budget?

Recent surveys show **80% of autistic Christians** (Catholic, Protestant and Orthodox) **do not attend** services in their local church. Father Mark Nolette, a Catholic autistic priest wrote an article, "[From the Anchorite: An open Letter to My Beloved Church](#)" on this very topic. On p45 in chapter 6 of Deaf Diaspora "it is reported that **only 2% of Deaf people in** the entire world are Christians".

September is suicide prevention month and the 10th is suicide prevention day.




2. **Sensory Friendly Mass.** Our diocese is an affiliate of NCPD so the cost is \$25. [Link to register and more information.](#)
