<u>Curriculum Resource Change – Family Formation from Ham Lake is removed from the</u> <u>Diocesan Approved Text List:</u>



Effective May 1, 2023 Bishop Joensen has accepted my recommendation to no longer support the Family Formation Curriculum from Ham Lake Minnesota. Parishes that currently use this curriculum will be able to use it through May 2024. Although the material is approved by the USCCB for conformity to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, we found the methodology lacking.

The areas we have concerns include pastoral, pedagogical, theological and qualitative. These concerns are shared by Tom Quinlan, director of the Saint Joseph Evangelization Center

(SJEC), and Paulette Chapman, consultant with SJEC and the Diocese of Des Moines. I have spent a lot of time with the director's manual, the monthly emails sent from the Family Formation team, and using the lessons with my grandchildren.

Our decision includes the following rationale:

- Family Formation is promoted as lectionary based process. However there is very little, if any, connection to the Sunday readings and Gospel. I have not found a lot of resourcing to parents in the area of lectionary based formation to help equip them for breaking open the liturgy of the Word. The resources for parents on Holy Week did not show up until their April newsletter.
- Lack of a scope and sequence to guide the methodology. Connections to the tasks of catechesis (knowledge of faith, celebrating the Christian mystery, morality, prayer, and introduction to the community life) and the pillars of the Catechism are not addressed.
- Parent materials do not help them with goals and objectives of the lesson. There is nothing that helps identify key terms. Most of the time I didn't find anything that identified activities differentiated for younger and older children.
- Popular piety seems to be on the same authoritarian level as Trinitarian and Sacramental Theology.

I strongly believe that family faith formation is the future. There are many other family formation curriculums a parish can use to continue a family approach to formation including Sophia Institute, Loyola Press, and Sadlier. The Diocese will also be exploring a pastoral care pathway for families in 2023 and 2024 through the Diocese of Orange. This pathway also has a family curriculum component that supplements their pastoral care process.

Please know I often try not to interfere with curriculum decisions of parish communities. However, there was growing evidence that Family Formation did not fit the expectations Bishop Joensen has for the curriculums offered for children and youth.

This will allow more opportunities for in-person connections.

- <u>Father Matthew Schneider</u> is another openly autistic priest diagnosed with autism after his first year of ministry when he failed to read the emotions on kids' faces as a school chaplain.
