



Diocese of Des Moines Confirmation Clergy Guide

Purpose of This Guide

This guide equips clergy of the Diocese of Des Moines to shepherd confirmandi, support families, and collaborate with parish formation leaders, catechists, and sponsors throughout the eleven-month Confirmation journey. It provides theological grounding, pastoral expectations, and structural clarity to ensure a unified and mission-centered sacramental preparation process.

The Role of Catholic Clergy

Clergy play a vital pastoral role in Confirmation preparation. Their responsibilities include:

- providing spiritual leadership through preaching, teaching, and sacramental ministry.
- supporting and collaborating with parish catechetical leaders involved in the implementation of the Confirmation process.
- supporting confirmandi and families with encouragement, presence, and prayer.
- guiding parish formation leaders and catechists to ensure fidelity to Diocesan standards.
- assisting sponsors in understanding their role and verifying their good standing.
- ensuring confirmandi are properly disposed to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.
- fostering belonging within the parish so families experience the Church as a spiritual home.
- Reviewing and discerning Confirmation requests in anticipation of the Diocesan policy of 6th grade

Sacrament of Confirmation Defined by the Catechism of the Catholic Church

The Catechism of the Catholic Church #1285 teaches that Confirmation, together with Baptism and the Eucharist, completes Christian initiation. Through Confirmation, the faithful receive:

- A special outpouring of the Holy Spirit.
- An indelible spiritual mark.
- A mission to spread and defend the faith by word and deed.

Confirmation Overview

Confirmation completes the initiation begun at Baptism. Parents nurture their child's faith from infancy, and clergy partner with them to strengthen belonging, affirm identity, foster encounters with Christ, and inspire missionary discipleship throughout their faith journey.

A Message from Bishop William Joensen

"Confirmation is a sacrament that's meant to strengthen baptismal grace and anchor a young person's identity in Christ. By celebrating the sacrament in sixth grade, we continue to build a solid faith foundation upon which our young people will sow God's spirit as they enter adolescence. It is our firm belief and hope that they will be emboldened with the gifts of wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, courage, and a devoted love for Jesus and his father, along with all God's saints. We infer that earlier confirmation better serves families and equips young people to see themselves as on mission to live as Jesus did and to share his love with others."

Diocese of Des Moines Confirmation Monthly Program Structure Overview

The Confirmation journey follows eleven monthly movements:

1. **Preparation:** Orientation, expectations, baptismal identity.
 - We focus on Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) 1267 and 1 Corinthians 12:12-14
2. **Identity:** Rediscovering one's identity as a beloved child of God.
 - We focus on CCC 1691 & 1700 and Isaiah 43:1 along with John 1:35-51
3. **Belonging:** Living belonging through service and Works of Mercy.
 - We focus on CCC 2447 and Matthew 25:35-40
4. **Encounter with Jesus:** Recognizing Christ in Scripture, Eucharist, and daily life.
 - We focus on CCC 426 and Luke 24:13-35
5. **Encounter with Scripture:** Learning to pray with Scripture.
 - We focus on CCC 683 and Acts 2:1-13
6. **Encounter with the Holy Spirit:** Understanding gifts and fruits of the Spirit.
 - We focus on CCC 1830-1832 and Galatians 5:22-23
7. **Retreat:** Deep personal encounter with Jesus through prayer and reflection.
 - We focus on CCC 1309 and Mark 9:2-8a
8. **Called to Mission:** Making Works of Mercy part of daily life.
 - We focus on CCC 1303 and Matthew 28:19-20
9. **Life in the Spirit:** Living as missionary disciples.
 - We focus on CCC 2472 and James 1:22
10. **Disciples at Home and Parish:** Practicing discipleship in daily life.
 - We focus on CCC 1285 and John 20:22-23
11. **Confirmation:** Completing initiation through the sacrament.
 - We focus on CCC 1316 and Acts 1:8

Diocese of Des Moines Confirmation Standards

- Family registered in a parish.
- Confirmandi must be baptized Catholic.
- Enrollment in Faith Formation, Catholic School, or Home School.
- Participation in monthly Confirmation sessions.
- Saint selection.
- Sponsor selection in good standing.
- Completion of At-Home Discussions.
- Completion of Sponsor Chats.
- Attendance at a retreat.
- Completion of family service activities.

Defining Standards

- **Registered and Baptized:** Families must be registered; proof of baptism provided if needed.
- **Enrollment in Formation:** Confirmandi must participate in parish Faith Formation, Catholic School, or Home School.
- **Saint Selection:** Confirmandi chooses a saint whose life inspires their discipleship.
- **Sponsor Selection:** Sponsor must be a practicing Catholic in good standing.
- **At-Home Discussions:** Monthly guided discussions completed with parents.
- **Sponsor Chats:** Three required conversations (and one optional) with the sponsor.

- **Instructional Program:** Attendance at monthly parish sessions.
- **Family Service Hours:** Three service activities completed as a family.

Statement of Understanding of Roles

Confirmandi Responsibilities

- Engage in parish life.
- Attend parish formation sessions.
- Complete monthly at-home formation.
- Engage in Scripture, prayer, and service.
- Select a Saint
- Participate in Sponsor Chats.
- Attend a retreat.

Parent Responsibilities

- Attend monthly formation.
- Lead at-home conversations.
- Document family service.
- Model prayer and discipleship.
- Engage in parish life.

Sponsor Responsibilities

- Complete the Diocesan Sponsor in Good Standing Form
- Complete Sponsor Chats.
- Attend the Confirmation Mass.
- Support ongoing discipleship.

Reception of Confirmation in Anticipation of Diocese of Des Moines Policy

It is a pastoral judgment by pastors to determine whether those elements required by the revised *Code of Canon Law* are indeed present, namely that the person be baptized, have the use of reason, be suitably instructed, and be properly disposed and able to renew the baptismal promises (cf. Canon 843, §1, 889, §2). When a member of the faithful wishes to receive this Sacrament, even though not satisfying one or more elements of the local norms, those elements must give way to the fundamental right of the faithful to receive the Sacraments.

In the Diocese of Des Moines, if one should present oneself to receive Confirmation before 6th grade, we support a pastor process with three simple components.

1. A short, content-based readiness interview

Pastor + parent + child 10–15 minutes Based on the curriculum's core goals:

- “Tell me about your Baptism.”
- “Who is Jesus to you?”
- “What does the Holy Spirit do?”
- “Why do you want to be confirmed?”

2. A one-page diocesan readiness checklist (a pastoral tool for documenting that the child understands the essentials):

- Identity as a child of God
- Belonging to the Church
- Jesus' call
- Basic understanding of the Holy Spirit
- Desire for the sacrament

3. A “Pastor's Determination Form”

Three checkboxes:
