- Practice Christ-line hospitality. Mental Illness can be isolating for the person and their family
- Request prayers for people experiencing a mental illness, respecting confidentiality in your parish intentions
- Parish opportunities for the Anointing of the Sick is meant for all people experiencing illness including mental illness.

Facts on Mental Illness:

- According to the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), one in five adults in our country will experience a mental health condition; 17% of youth (ages 6-17) experience a mental health disorder
- People with mental illness have a biological disorder which can be treated with a combination of medications and counseling just as people with diabetes are treated with insulin and diet
- Mental Illness often co-occurs with other conditions such as drug addiction and homelessness
- Early intervention, as with other types of illnesses, leads to better outcomes for the person and their family
