Matching - Multi-sensory Activity

OVERVIEW

Have students match up parts of the picture as they hear the story from Luke 2: 8-20

MATERIALS NEEDED

- 1. Wonderful Works Shepherd Scene and Matching Squares
- 2. Scissors
- 3. Glue Stick

ACTIVITY

Story - Shepherds are visited by an angel and told of Jesus birth - Luke: 8-20

Idea - Incorporating hands-on activities while listening to a story promotes learning.

How it works - Print out the scene and matching squares. Have students cut each square and paste on the scene as they listen to the story. Squares can also be cut ahead of time if needed.

Story Summary:

One night some shepherds were tending their sheep when something amazing happened! An angel of the Lord appeared to them in the sky. The angel was shining bright and the shepherds were afraid. (Would you be afraid if you were the shepherds?) The angel told them not to fear! "Fear not. I bring you good news of great joy for all of the people." The angel told the shepherds that a baby had been born. This child was, Christ, our Lord. They could find him lying in a manger.

Suddenly more angels appeared and they began praising God. (Wow! Can you imagine that? What do you think they would sound like?) Then the angels returned to Heaven.

The shepherds were so excited that they decided to go see baby Jesus for themselves. They praised God and continued to spread the good news! And so can we!
