Summary

The Campus Minister plans, directs, and implements ministry programs and assists the pastor of St. Catherine of Siena Student Center and Parish with the day-to-day functions and ministries of the Student Center.

St. Catherine of Siena Campus Minister serves the students, faculty, and staff of Drake University. The Campus Minister also supports students at other colleges and universities in the Diocese of Des Moines. Our engagement of students happens through leadership development, authentic and inclusive personal accompaniment, vibrant worship, community-building, lifelong faith formation, and service to the wider community.

- Collaborates with the DU Bulldog Catholic faculty advisor
- Collaborates with Diocesan Staff, University organizations, the Iowa Catholic Campus Ministry Association, and the National Catholic Campus Ministry Association to provide programming for all students
- Collaborates with the Encounter Faith Formation Committee regarding specific programs
- Organizes Newman Community Lectures
- Coordinates Student Supper and Student Service Programs

Physical Demands

This position requires regularly working evenings and weekends as needed throughout the academic year as well as overseeing one to two overnight retreats per year.

The Sunday Student Mass takes place at 5 pm, followed by Student Suppers. There is an additional Student Mass at 9:15 pm on Thursday.

The position requires clear background and driving checks and successful candidates must participate in the safe environment training and follow the protocols of the Diocese of Des Moines.
